MINOR GUIDE - ARABIC

DECLARING A MINOR

Students with good academic standing who have declared a major in any department and have completed 45 credits at the University of Washington may declare a minor by setting up an appointment with their major adviser. Students with a major in the Middle Eastern Languages & Civilization department may declare a minor in Arabic, but only 60% of the coursework applied to the minor can overlap with the major.

- At least 15 credits applied to the minor must be at the 300-level or above.
- At least 15 credits applied to the minor must be taken in residency at UW.
- A 2.00 GPA must be maintained among all courses applied to the minor.
