DECLARING THE MAJOR

This is an open major. Students may declare it anytime by setting up an appointment with an adviser at Humanities Academic Services.

PATHWAY TO THE MAJOR

15-30 Credits – Modern Language Training

Complete through the second-year level (101, 102, 103, 201, 203, 203) in one of the following languages: Bengali, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Sanskrit, Urdu, or Vietnamese.

Students with incoming proficiency must complete a minimum of 15 credits at the 200-level or above to fulfill this requirement.

30 Credits – Tertiary Elective Courses

Students can choose any 6 additional language and/or disciplinary AL&L courses to complete the major, subject to meeting the major's other requirements.

10 credits can be applied from outside the AL&L department.

60 Credits minimum with the following requirements:

- At least 30 credits must be at the 300-level or above.
- At least 30 credits applied to the major must be taken in residency at UW.
- A 2.00 GPA must be maintained among all courses applied to the major.
