DECLARING THE MINOR

Comparative History of Ideas (CHID) is an open major. Students with good academic standing may declare the major at any time by setting up an appointment with the <u>CHID advising team</u>.

PATHWAY TO THE MAJOR

<u> 15 Credits – Gateways to CHID</u>

CHID 101 is required.

Fulfill the remaining 10 credits by taking two of the following: CHID 205, 207, 210, 222, 250, 260, 280, 380, 480

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5+ Credits - Cultural and Historical Engagements

This can be fulfilled in one of three ways:

1. CHID Study Abroad (1 quarter)

2. Local/Global Engagements (1 course)

Fulfilled by courses with field work/community work and/or courses where students work with communities outside of the U.S.

Fulfill this requirement by taking CHID 390.

Prerequisites: CHID 101, CHID 390, 2 Gateways to CHID courses, and 1 Ideas in the World course

13-18 Credits - Upper-Division CHID Electives

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Can be satisfied by any course with a CHID prefix at the 300 or 400-level, so long as the CHID adviser has agreed that the classes fit into the student's chosen area of study.

10 or 15 Credits - Senior Thesis/Capstone Project

The requirement can be fulfilled by one of the 10-credit or 15-credit classes listed below.

- 10-credit classes: CHID 491 and 493
- 15-credit classes: CHID 491, 492, and 493

This must be completed after CHID 390.

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- **30 Credits** minimum with the following requirements:
 - At least 20 credits applied to the major must be taken in residency at UW.
 - A 2.00 GPA must be maintained among all courses applied to the major.
