DECLARING THE MAJOR

This is a minimum requirements major. Students who have completed one C LIT prerequisite course, an English Composition course or Writing course, and have a cumulative 2.00 GPA may declare the major by setting up an appointment with an adviser at Humanities Academic Services.

PATHWAY TO THE MAJOR

5 Credits - Prerequisite Course

Choose one of the following: C LIT 250, 251, 252

25 Credits – Core Curriculum

Complete the following four requirements:

- 1. C LIT 400
- 2. Any 300-level cinema studies course
- 3. Any C LIT course at or above the 300-level
- 4. 3 different courses from the following series, with at least one class per series: Series 1: C LIT 320, 321, 322, 323

Series 2: C LIT 360, 361, 362

15 Credits – 300 and 400-level Electives

Classes discussing literature, cinema, or media studies in the following departments can apply: Asian Languages and Literatures, Cinema & Media Studies, Classics, English, Germanics, Middle Eastern Literatures and Civilization, French & Italian Studies, Spanish & Portuguese Studies, Scandanavian Studies, and Slavic Languages and Literatures.

Check with a HAS adviser to see if a course applies.

45 Credits minimum with the following requirements:

- At least 5 credits of the major must focus on literature written before 1800.
- A 2.00 GPA must be maintained in all classes counting towards the major.
- No course taken to fulfill major requirements can be taken S/NS or C/NC.
- A minimum of 30 credits must be taken in residency at UW.
