DECLARING A MINOR

Students with good academic standing who have declared a major in any department and have completed 45 credits at the University of Washington may declare a minor by setting up an appointment with their major adviser.

PATHWAY TO THE MINOR

10 Credits - Introductory Courses

One of C LIT 250, 251, or 252
AND C LIT 400

+

10 Credits - Upper-Division Electives

300- and 400-level literature, cinema, or media courses from among the offerings in Comparative Literature and the following Departments: *Asian Languages & Literature, Classics, English, Germanics, Near Eastern Languages & Civilization, Romance Languages & Literature, Scandinavian Studies, and Slavic Languages & Literature*. They may be taught in the original language or in translation.

+

10 Credits - Literature Courses

2 differently-numbered courses from C LIT 320, 322, 323, and 341

=

30 Credits with the following requirements:

- At least 15 credits applied to the minor must be at the 300-level or above.
- At least 15 credits applied to the minor must be taken in residency at UW.
- A 2.00 GPA must be maintained among all courses applied to the minor.
