

MAJOR GUIDE – COMPARATIVE CIVILIZATIONS

DECLARING A MAJOR

This is an open major. Students who are in good academic standing may declare the major at any time by setting up an appointment with an adviser at Humanities Academic Services.

PATHWAY TO THE MAJOR

10 Credits – Introductory Courses

All students are required to take NEAR E 101.

One 200-level NEAR E course is also required. This includes any of the following:

NEAR E 201, 202, 203, 207, 208, 209, 299, 230, 231, 232, 234, 243, 244, 257, 258, 259, 261, 262, 264, 265, 266, 267, 268, 270, 271, 285, 286, 287, 288, 296

+

5 Credits – Senior Year Courses

NEAR E 491 must be taken during the last Autumn quarter of the program.

NEAR E 498 must be taken the Winter or Spring quarter following NEAR E 491.

+

30 Credits – Near Eastern Language Courses

Students may choose to study Arabic, Persian, Turkish, Modern Hebrew, or Uzbek.

Credits are broken down as follows:

- 15 credits: 101, 102, and 103
- 15 credits: 201, 202, and 203

Placement/proficiency tests can be used to surpass certain/all levels. Summer intensive classes (105 and 205) can be used to satisfy 100 and 200-level requirements.

25 Credits – Upper Division Courses

+

Any NEAR E courses at the 300-level or above may apply.

72 Credits minimum with the following requirements:

- A 2.00 GPA must be maintained among all courses applied to the major.
- 22 credits must be taken in-residence at the Middle Eastern Languages and Civilization Department.
