

# MINOR GUIDE – MODERN HEBREW

## DECLARING A MINOR

Students with good academic standing who have declared a major in any department and have completed 45 credits at the University of Washington may declare a minor by setting up an appointment with their major adviser. Students with a major in the Middle Eastern Languages & Civilization department may declare a minor in Modern Hebrew, but only 60% of the coursework applied to the minor can overlap with the major.

## PATHWAY TO THE MINOR

### 10 Credits –

#### Upper-Division MODHEB Courses

MODHEB 401, 402, 404, 405, 406, 407, 408, 490, 496, 499

+

### 15 Credits –

#### MODHEB 200 Language Series

MODHEB 201, 202, and 203

Students with language proficiency beyond the 2<sup>nd</sup>-year series (from test, high school, native speaker, etc.) should take 20 credits of upper-division courses with the MODHEM prefix and 10 electives.

+

### 5 Credits -

#### Elective Coursework

MODHEM: 100, any upper-division course  
NEAR E: 101, 287, 310, 316, 317, 318, 321, 325

=

### 30 Credits with the following requirements:

- At least 15 credits applied to the minor must be at the 300-level or above.
- At least 15 credits applied to the minor must be taken in residency at UW.
- A 2.00 GPA must be maintained among all courses applied to the minor.
