

# MINOR GUIDE – TURKIC

## DECLARING A MINOR

Students with good academic standing who have declared a major in any department and have completed 45 credits at the University of Washington may declare a minor by setting up an appointment with their major adviser. Students with a major in the Middle Eastern Languages & Civilization department may declare a minor in Turkic, but only 60% of the coursework applied to the minor can overlap with the major.

## PATHWAY TO THE MINOR

### 10 Credits – Upper Division Courses

KAZAK 401, 402, 403                      UYGUR 401, 402, 403  
UZBEK 401, 402, 403                      CHGTAI 401, 402

### 15 Credits – 200-Level Language Courses

KAZAKH 201, 202, and 203  
UYGUR 201, 202, and 203  
UZBEK 201, 202, and 203

Students with language proficiency beyond the 2<sup>nd</sup>-year series (from test, high school, native speaker, etc.) should take 20 credits of upper-division courses with the TURKIC prefix and earn 10 credits of electives.

### 5 Credits - Elective Coursework

Any upper-division course with the KAZAK, UZBEK, or UYGUR prefix  
NEAR E 101, 257, 257, 259, 266, 267, 269, 270, 357, 358, 359, 360

=

### 30 Credits with the following requirements:

- At least 15 credits applied to the minor must be at the 300-level or above.
- At least 15 credits applied to the minor must be taken in residency at UW.
- A 2.00 GPA must be maintained among all courses applied to the minor.
