ENGLISH MAJOR PATHWAYS

The University of Washington English Department offers two distinct English major tracks: Language, Literature, and Culture, and Creative Writing.

Both programs offer intensive study of English language and literary forms. This study is broken down into the following three concentration areas:

- **Historical Depth:** courses focusing on texts published before 1700 and before 1945, which provide students with an understanding of literary movements throughout time.
- **Power & Difference:** courses focusing on how identity and power shape and are shaped by literature and language.
- **Genre, Method, & Language:** courses focusing on literary theory via genre study, rhetorical method, and varieties of English across registers and communities. *Because Creative Writing workshops include intensive study of genre and rhetoric, there is no separate Genre, Method, and Language requirement for <i>Creative Writing students.*

- Focus on courses that overlap, like ENGL 202, Power & Difference, and Historical Depth classes.
- Take ENGL 283 (Intro to Verse) or ENGL 284 (Intro to Prose) to explore a CW workshop. If you do not have any transfer CW credit, the course can apply to either track of the major.
- Speak with faculty in the English department.
