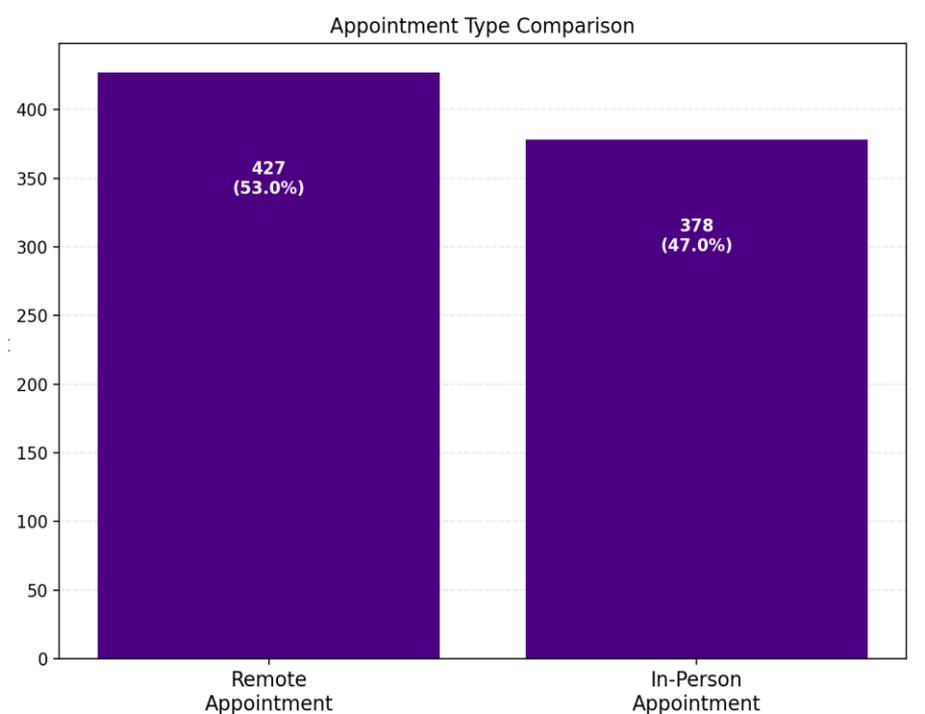
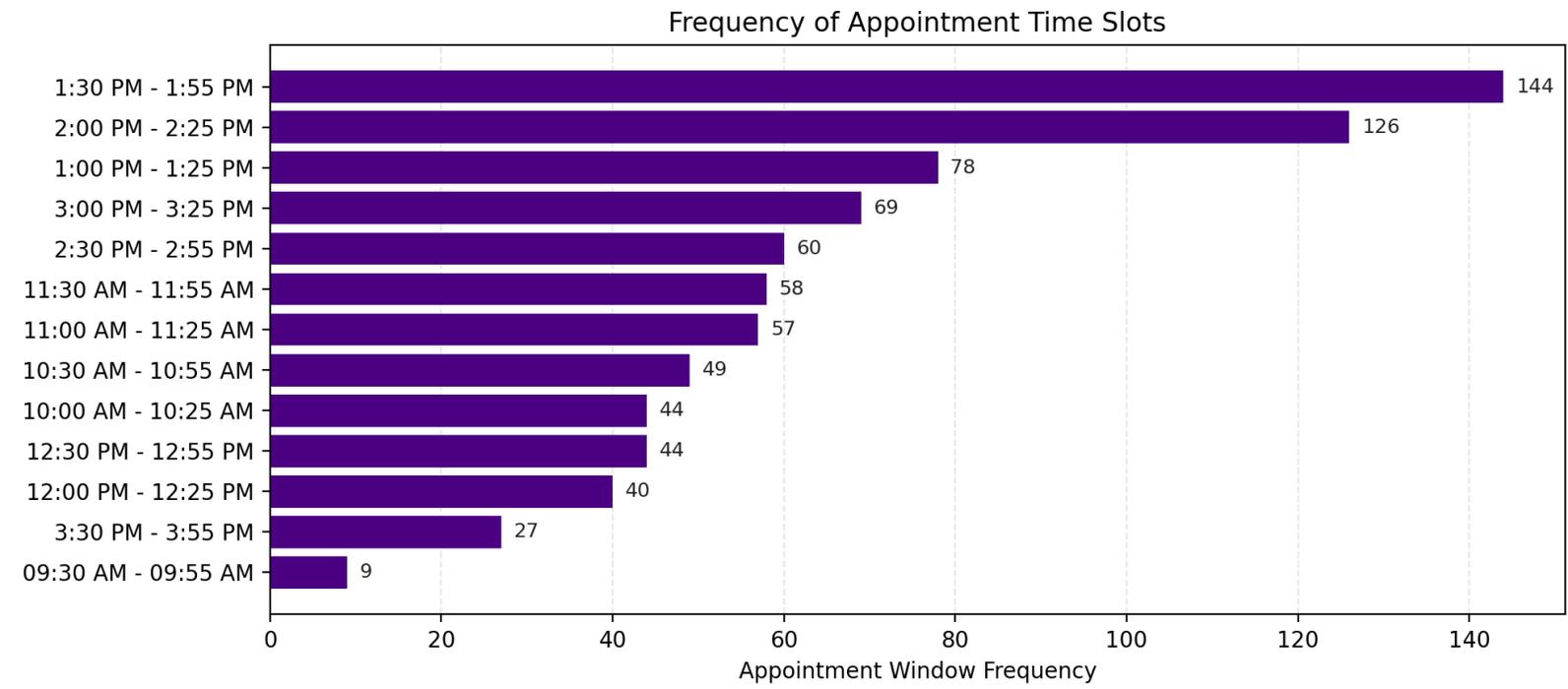

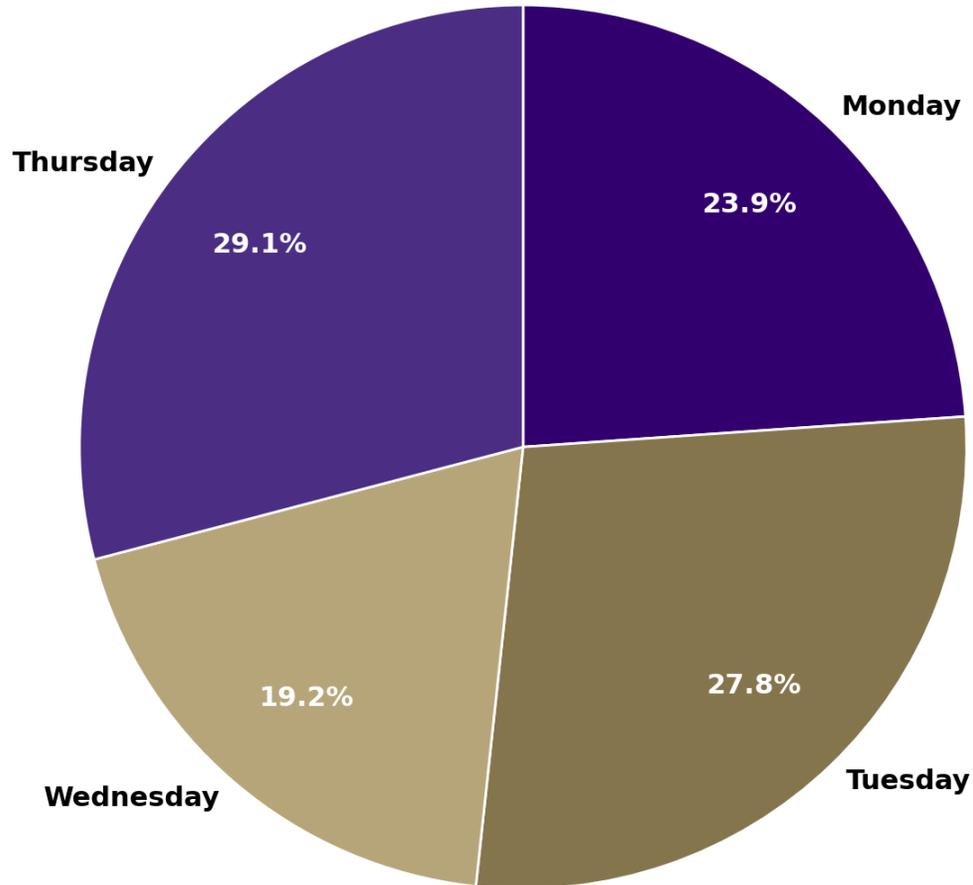

Appointments by Day of the Week (Mon - Thu)

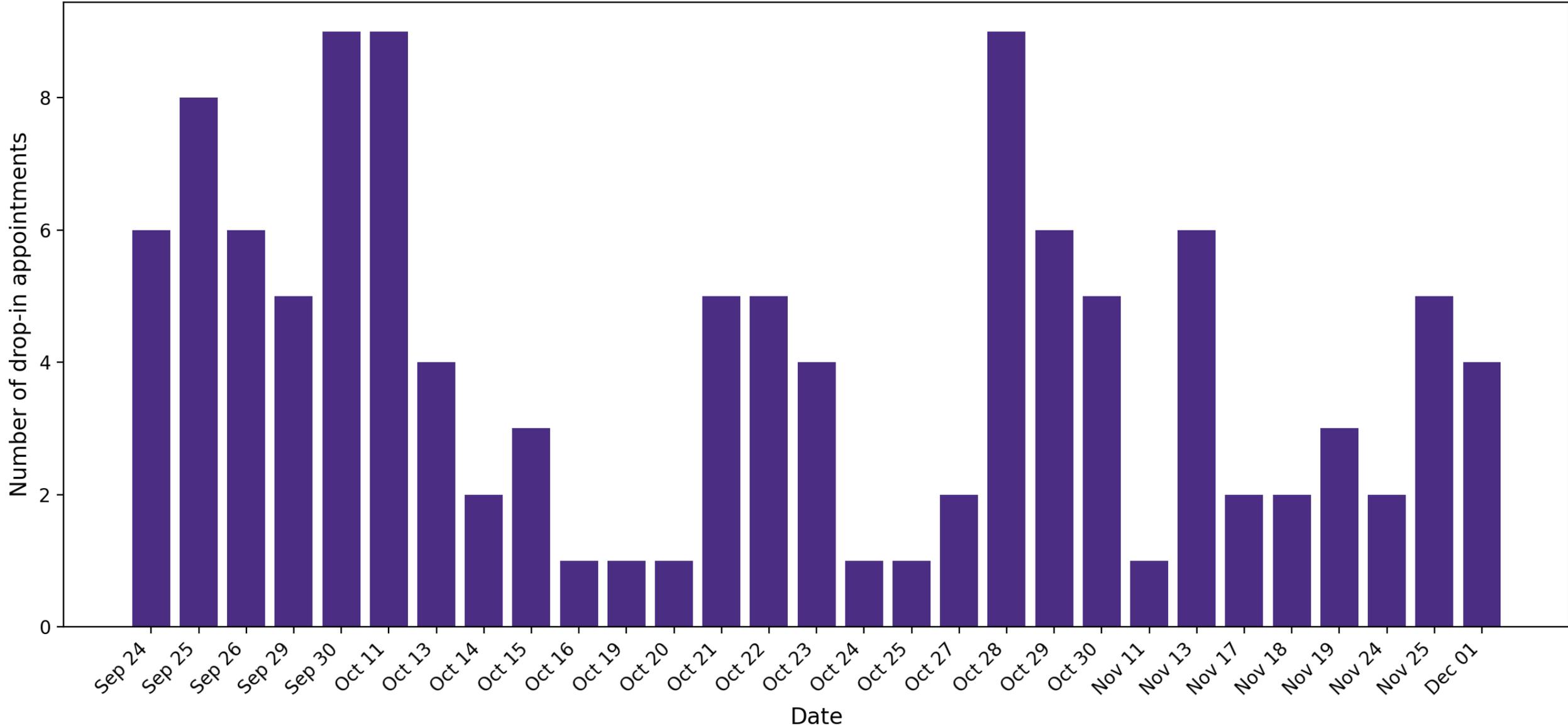

Advising Demand Trends Analysis for Autumn 2025: Conclusions

- Scheduled appointment demand remained steady between week 2 and week 5, jumping around week 6 to coincide with the start of winter quarter registration. After the Thanksgiving holiday, demand dropped considerably as schedules became confirmed and classes filled.
- Drop-in demand starts high at the start of the quarter and then dips (likely replaced by scheduled advising) between weeks 2 and 6, spiking to coincide with winter registration demand.
- Demand was higher for in person drop-in services: 59-41. Scheduled appointment demand skewed more towards virtual over in-person because of greater availability and convenience during the period around the Thanksgiving holiday.
- The middle of the week sees the most demand for service: Tuesdays and Thursdays are the most popular days for seeking adviser support.
- No correlation with cancellations and appointment types: in-person appointments were cancelled at roughly the same rate as virtual. People did no-show more readily for virtual appointments (2:1 ratio), but numbers were not huge; technical issues may be to blame.
- Early afternoon appointment slots were the most popular. Because of language classes, students were more reticent to come in before 11 unless they had no choice.
